Meet Jeff Hayhurst



New Community Bridge Club Bateau Bay player Jeff Hayhurst (with co-driver David Walters - aka Team Grey? No Mad!) is participating in the Cancer Council partnered Shitbox Rally in Autumn 2024, driving approximately 5,000 km on mostly outback tracks from Adelaide to Perth via Uluru. In fact, you may recognise their car which has been driving around recently having also completed a similar charity rally from Rockhampton to Hobart!



So far these events have raised over \$37million for the Cancer Council, funding vital research into treatment and cures in Australia over the last 10+ years!

As well as distance and outback track challenges, all cars must be worth less than \$1,500, hence the rally name. Jeff and David's old car will be joining 250 other cars, with the vital support of mechanical teams, medics and the very experienced Shitbox Rally organisers.





Importantly, these Rallies are not a race, rather a challenge to achieve the unthinkable in old cars, travelling across Australia via some of its most formidable roads and visiting remote communities, who also greatly appreciate the extra income the rally events provide.

During the next Rally, all the teams aim to again raise \$2+million for Cancer Council.

As you can see in the photos, their fun decorated miniature roof top box "Rock", has drawn a good deal of positive interest, as Jeff and David's Autumn 2024 rally will pass by Uluru.
